their depth of understanding



By a long shot, the world's wisest farmer is considerably younger than the tomato farmer, but he has more experience in the sense that he has grown root vegetables, fruits, nuts, and legumes in a variety of climates, seasons, and locations around the world. He can't speak to farming as a whole in the same way the younger, more experienced farmer can.

If the entirety of our life experience is repetitive, monotonous and practically unchanging, age will not grant us wisdom. If we want to be wise, we must become life students and learn as much as we can through experience.

A person with accelerated wisdom or wiser than those with their age has always been called an old soul. Hearing someone claim, "She has an old soul," as if they can see into their soul, is always amusing. The calm, relaxed, no nonsense kind of people: they are commonly described as an old soul. These individuals concentrate on the here and now, but still understand the significance of where they come from and where they are going.

To be called an old soul is a compliment itself. It implies that we are wise beyond our years, with many more ahead of us to make good choices, bring good to the world, and our life. But if we are the person being told we have an old soul, we might not know exactly what it means. In fact, we could have spent our whole lives trying to fit in with a community that

cherishes youth and action. Of course, now we use the term to refer to someone who has wisdom beyond their years.

Others tend to use it as someone who is more enlightened than other people who are their age. An old soul is a unique kind of person that not many people come across. 





## The Historical MASSEY HALL



he lights go down, the band comes out, and the audience roars. The atmosphere glows with thousands of people gathered together for one purpose. Many of us now couldn't imagine a life without concerts.

With shows slowly coming back after a year without them, people are scrambling to buy tickets and go out again. However, prior to 1894, there were no music venues in Toronto. Hart Massey changed that.

Hart Massey was a Canadian businessman and member of the prominent Massey family. Born in 1823, Massey worked in his father's manufacturing company until he became the sole owner following his father's death in 1856. By the 1880s,

Massey was ready to retire and pass the company on to his son Charles, however Charles suddenly died of typhoid in 1884, forcing Massey to return to the company.

Charles's death hit his father hard – he decided that his family should never be forgotten by the public and began creating various monuments for his son. By 1888, Massey's dreams of opening

a major music hall in Toronto would take shape when he asked Canadian architect, Sidney Rose Badgley to draw up the plans. Massey had a lifelong interest in music and served as the vice-president of the Toronto Philharmonic Society in 1891.

This, combined with his desire to design another memorial for his son Charles, is ultimately what motivated Massey to build the grand hall.

Massey purchased land at Shuter and Victoria streets in 1892. Designed by Sidney Rose Badgley and built under the supervision of Toronto architect George Miller, construction of the hall occurred between 1893 and 1894. Massey

Music Hall officially opened on June 14, 1894 with a performance of Handel's Messiah performed by a 500-member chorus and 70-member orchestra.

It was around this time that Massey's health also began declining as a result of what he was told was heart disease. He attended the show against his doctor's orders. Massey died less than two years later in February of 1896.

Massey Hall's phenomenal acoustic properties combined with the need for a public venue meant that the hall immediately became an epicenter for musical and public functions.

Massey Hall was the only substantial

venue that the city had until the creation of Roy Thomson Hall almost 100 years later. Many icons of the 20th century would perform at Massey Hall, including Dizzy Gillespie, Bob Dylan, Prince, and Billy Joel just to name a few.

In 1973, the City of Toronto named Massey Hall on its first-ever list of heritage sites with the city stating that the hall served as one of Canada's most important cultural institutions. It is without a doubt that Massey Hall played a large role in the development of Toronto's vibrant music community. If we didn't have a creative and cultural hub to gather during the 20th century, the city would likely look very different.


The building itself is a three-story, red brick concert hall built in a conservative late Palladian-revival style. The building features a slightly projected centre block and lower, hipped roof side wings. The façade features symmetrical round and flatheaded windows separated by fluted pilasters and a triple-door entry under its inscribed name. Inside the hall, elaborate decorations and use of Moorish elements create a lavish environment. Horseshoe arches and scalloped ceiling hangings with carved trim saturate the hall.

The arrangement of the space as well as the chosen surface finish help foster the acoustic properties that the hall is renowned for.

Massey Hall originally seated 3,500 patrons but in 1933, renovations at the hall reduced the seating capacity to 2,675. Renovations at this time saw the creation of a new lounge, an enlarged ground floor entrance area, and the flammable wooden stairs replaced with stone and steel. In 1948, concerns over fire safety led to the installation of concrete under the stage and ground floor seating, bringing the capacity to 2,753.

With no major renovations for decades, the Federal Government of Canada committed \$8 million in 2013 to begin the process of revitalizing Massey Hall. In 2018, it was announced that the hall would be closed for at least two years while it undergoes renovations. Initially, the plan was to renovate the existing stage and lobby, but in late 2020 Massey Hall announced that they received a significant investment from real estate company, Allied Properties, and they would be vastly expanding the scope of the project.

The biggest change is the inclusion of a new 7-story multi-purpose performance facility adjacent to the hall, called Allied Music Centre. In a press release, Massey Hall stated the facility would include



two new state-of-the-art performance venues and dedicated spaces for Artist Development and Education & Outreach initiatives.

On Massey Hall's 127th birthday this past June 14th, it was announced that they would be re-opening the hall in November, three years after starting renovations. The club will officially reopen on November 25th with a three-night performance from Gordon Lightfoot, who was also the last artist to perform at the hall before the closed in 2018.



are also establishing a new product line which stands for the 'lifestyle' dimension in our product strategy," says Oliver Blume, Chairman of the Executive Board of Porsche AG.

Exclusive paintwork in Cherry Metallic and four other available exterior colours along with gold logos create an authentic look in the 1950s style. The exterior of the 911 Targa 4S Heritage Design edition features high-quality white livery with a historical design. The spear-shaped graphic motorsports elements on the front wings are particularly striking. These "spears" recall the early days of Porsche motorsports.

A further highlight is the Porsche Heritage badge on the engine lid grill in the rear, which is reminiscent of the one that was awarded back in the day when a Porsche 356 reached the 100,000 kilometers mark. The quality seal from the past – with a modern twist – will grace the rear of all four Porsche Heritage Design models.

standard 20/21-inch Carrera Exclusive Design wheels and the Black classic-look brake calipers.



Growing up in Toronto's traditionally Italian neighbourhood of St.Clair and Oakwood, Vittorio spent a great deal of time with both sets of grandparents who instilled in him a passion for all things food related, from growing it, to cooking it and, of course, enjoying the fruits of their labour over family dinners.

Italian on his paternal side and English on the maternal, Vittorio benefitted from a melding of cultural traditions that found common ground in the love of food. "My grandparents on my mother's side owned a farm in Lowville, Ontario, and my nonno and nonna would come up and plant their vegetables all together. Come harvest time I'd spend all day picking the vegetables and then we'd flash freeze them and store them. The basement was always full of home grown produce."

Although his family eventually moved to the more 'gentrified' city of Burlington, Vittorio' affinity for the grittier, working-class neighbourhoods remained in his blood. Finding inspiration from the restaurants in Detroit, he always knew that he would end up opening in Hamilton. The juxtaposition of the beauty and the darkness of a city or town that has had its challenges appeals to him. "Hamilton is not cookie cutter; it has great architecture and the people have a bit of an edge to them. I love the area and the people and I think there's a great community here."







The former Top Chef Canada competitor got his start at the iconic restaurant, George, in Toronto under the tutelage of Chef Lorenzo Loseto, who Vittorio credits with providing him with an excellent apprenticeship. Starting from the bottom, cutting vegetables, he was able to move quickly up the ranks honing his skill set. He eventually opened his first venture, The Good Son on Toronto's trendy Queen Street.

The need to venture out on his own led to the opening of Born and Raised 6 years ago. The exposed brick walls and the tractor seat bar stools confirm

that the space is one where everyone is welcome to come as they are. The focal point of the restaurant is the wood burning oven situated in the dining area from where authentic Napolitano style pizzas are created. Vittorio has always loved cooking over a wood fire but conversely is very proud of the restaurant's raw dishes: oysters, crudo tartare. My favourite menu item is their gnocchi, which Vittorio helped his nonna make from scratch every Sunday when he was a child.

As we speak, Vittorio and his team are just gearing up to reopen patio dining after

the latest covid 19 lockdown is eased. Rather than bemoaning the hardships that he has endured in the industry over the past year and a half, Vittorio prefers to focus on the silver lining associated with the shutdown.

"I was drained I wasn't focussed and my work was suffering. I was executive chef for 6 locations. now I am focusing all my efforts on Born and Raised. I want to establish a proper work /life balance for me and my staff, and I want to create a sustainable business model not only on the business side but to devise the most enjoyable experience possible for our customers."

"I like walking into a restaurant and feeling like nothing else matters. I want our customers to come here and to feel restored, not to be rushed."

Vittorio is truly appreciative as to how the Hamilton community has embraced Born and Raised and rooted for it during the closure. "I would get calls of support, people telling us how they hoped we would survive this and doing what they could to support us while in house dining was unavailable."

Now firmly ensconced as part of

Hamilton's fabric, Vittorio and his staff recognise the importance of paying it forward. They partake in a charitable venture spearheaded by Born's chef Johnny Segundo, where they prepare 75 meals for the kids associated with Living Rock Youth Resources, using quality ingredients and creating simple, great tasting food.

Vittorio has also initiated the opportunity for talented aspiring chefs to operate pop up restaurants once a month from his space on the days Born is closed "I want to provide opportunities for them to gain experience and earn some income, and to understand what running a restaurant is all about."

More than anything Vittorio is keen to ensure that there is a sustainable future for the restaurant industry as a whole "There's something very humbling about eating with another person and cooking for people to have a mutual experience. People depend on restaurants."

Vittorio strives to offer a dining experience that gives people hope, to band together and all grow stronger." Born and Raised ticks all those boxes.

### foods that can cause heart problems

ardiovascular disease has now dropped to the second leading cause of death in Canada, which means that it is still a problem to be reckoned with. The numbers of people with heart disease are decreasing in Canada, so here's a shout-out to Canadians, not to proclaim victory over this terrible illness, but to say you are making strides to control its effects. Those effects are hypertension, obesity, high cholesterol and diabetes just to name the most common ones, and they are as a rule interrelated and mostly attributed to bad diet practices. So, as we offer a hearty "well done", there is still much work to do. To help, here are five foods that should be avoided whenever possible.

1 Soft drinks It is really hard to defend why sugary drinks should be consumed at all, even in moderation. Throw 10 tsp. of sugar into your system each time you finish a regular soda, and then imagine drinking a few every day. A study followed young





adults during a 20-year time period and established that high consumption of sugary drinks was associated with high cholesterol, hypertension and high ranges of triglycerides, each being triggers for heart disease. Diet soda yields the same dietary benefits: zero.

2 Fried fish There are so many health benefits to fish, particularly on how it helps reduce cardiovascular disease risk. But with all healthy foods, the way it is prepared will go far in determining any benefits you will truly reap. Add to your fish an unhealthy bread coating, then put it in the deep fryer and all your health benefits get lost. When tests had been conducted evaluating fried fish to baked or broiled, the results confirmed a 50% higher risk for heart problems with the deep-fried fish. So, plan to consume fish at least twice a week, but stay away from the deep frier. As an alternative either broil, steam, bake or sauté your fish in a small amount of olive oil for the most effective health results.

3 Any meat that has been processed So just what is processed meat? Generally, it's a term we use for meat that has been modified to taste better or give it a longer shelf life. Hot dogs, bacon, canned meats and bologna are only a few examples of processed meats. Compared with red meats they had a 42% higher heart attack risk. They contain fat, salt, nitrates,

cholesterol and preservatives. Smarter options will be unprocessed chicken, turkey and fish.

4 Any food containing trans fat They will make food taste better, however from the dietary standpoint they're a nightmare. In the 1990s, Canada had one of the highest levels of Trans's Fat intake in the world. In 2018 Canada passed a law to nearly eliminate Trans Fat from all foods, but this legislation did not apply to naturally occurring Trans Fats, which can be found in some animal-based foods such as cheese, beef, lamb and milk. Even though Trans Fats are thankfully being legislated out of our diet gradually, continue to check food labels and avoid them at all costs

5 Salad dressing We can put together some amazingly wonderful salads, healthy and beautiful to look at, and then bring them down with loads of bottled salad dressing full of sugar, saturated fat, preservatives and salt. All of these ingredients have been linked to heart disease, hypertension and elevated levels of cholesterol. Salads should be a necessary part of our diet, but increase their health benefits by using a healthy dressing. Consider making your own, since you can come across many great recipes on the internet that offer much better health values than store-bought

#### 3 ways to develop STRONG CORE MUSCLES

ne importance of keeping our core muscles strong and flexible is an essential part in having an active lifestyle, and that goes double as we age.

Core muscle strength not only can help decrease lower back pain, but helps a person gain greater flexibility and equilibrium. All this allows us to do what we love to do, such travel and sports activities, to be enjoyable experiences, and not physical burdens.

Plus, keeping better balance minimizes injuries from falls and pulled muscles, aggravations that only slow us down.

So, knowing that, let's examine three workout routines which have been commonly accepted as good ways to build core muscles, and some of the disadvantages each can also have.

#### Yoga

There are actually several varieties for yoga, and yoga aficionados learn to integrate yoga's physical, mental and spiritual properties to strengthen the system and enhance blood flow.

People have been doing forms of yoga for about 5,000 years and many versions have been spawned, from workout routines which are gentle and intended to temporarily relieve muscles and joints to those routines that can be extremely intensive.

explanation why countless senior citizens Pilates is a wonderful choice. are utilizing this as central to their workout

Yoga instructors can furthermore offer routines specifically for people suffering from backache or arthritis.

Some people who experience back pain have a condition called ligament laxity, or ligaments that have become overly flexible due to injury, or perhaps a condition some people are born with.

Ligament laxity is a topic for larger discussion, but it is important to know that people with this condition need to tailor their workouts to strengthen the lower back region but not damage it.

But for most people, studies have revealed that just by doing yoga without the other strength training they were able to noticeably increase their strength, particularly in the core area.

#### Pilates

Named after fitness trainer Joseph Pilates, these exercises are based on maintaining balanced movements. These will assist core strength, graceful movement and suppleness.

A research study at Auburn University in the United States revealed that when people did ten reps of Pilates abdominal workouts versus the same number of normal crunches, the Pilates results for strengthening abdominal muscles was This adaptability is arguably one far superior. For toning up the midsection

For alleviating back pain, though, there seems to be some debate on how much Pilates may help.

An older study found it didn't reduce pain or increase overall performance in comparison with other forms of physical exercises for the back. Perhaps the cause for this is that a painful back normally arises from poor physical posture and poor body mechanics.

But when back pain is caused by weak abdominal muscles, building that core strengthen could well be the ticket for a strong back. Because many Pilates moves could damage the back, a certified trainer would be highly recommended before jumping into a Pilates program.

#### Foundation Training

Created by chiropractor Dr. Eric Goodman, Foundation Training does not have the familiarity of the others. These routines take a different approach to core training, and are designed to unlock the posterior chain and decompress, or lengthen, the spine. This will improve stability and reduce back pain. The basic idea is to teach the integrated chains of muscles that connect to the core to work together in harmony. These muscles connect with the pelvis, the glutes, hamstrings and adductor muscles.

his past summer, Barbara Rourke and Jason St John, founders of LA-based design studio, Bells + Whistles, completed Marrow Mid-century, a residential project in Palm Springs, CA.

The team was selected by Jillian and Tim Sassone, the founders of the fine jewelry brand, Marrow Fine, to design a home that embraced colour and pattern but also felt "homey" since they have small children.

This is the second project they have teamed up on; in 2019, Bells + Whistles completed the design of the Marrow Fine Flagship in San Diego, CA.

Originally built in 1957 by renowned mid-century modern architect, Donald Wexler, the home has been deemed architecturally significant and is registered as a historic site.

The home is part of Thunderbird North, an enclave of 10 homes designed by mid-century masters, Cody, Wexler & Harrison. The B+W team began









designing the Palm Springs based "Marrow Mid-century" home in Fall 2019 and completed the project in July 2020.

Per B+W, "Marrow Mid-century is where Donald Wexler meets acid fantasy. Every area of the 1957 compound has been transformed with injections of vivid colour, hypnotic pattern, and desert magic, creating the quintessential California getaway house."

What you've probably already seen is the spectacular IG-perfect pool designed by Alex Proba. B+W discovered Proba's

design paralysis to the mix.


